On Friday, we will have lectures from both the University of Florida and Nova Southeastern University 3rd year residents. SATURDAY LECTURE INFORMATION:

A Periodontally Centered Morning Program

Dr. Robert Levine will cover various aspects of diagnosis, treatment planning, and surgical treatment using his 37 years of clinical and teaching experience using the "Team Approach." The morning program will be periodontology-centered and will include case planning and treatment techniques which improve case acceptance. Thorough clinical documentation is a vital component of his "team communication" and success in case presentations to his internet-savvy patients. The topics to be covered include "predictable" evidence-based treatment protocols including the management of advanced periodontitis, the Miller-McEntire Periodontal Prognosis Index (MMPPI) outlining the benefits of its use, as well as Piezosurgery-assisted surgical procedures including ridge preservation, Ti-mesh, bioactive biologics, and laser therapy. In addition, soft tissue grafting using CTGs, acellular dermal matrix and collagen-based products for "phenotype conversion" will be shared. Focus will be on patient acceptance and patient-reported outcome measures (PROMS) which we daily experience in our practices as positive "Google Reviews."

An Implant Centered Afternoon Program

Dr. Robert Levine will address the close interaction of the periodontist with the restorative dentist and the dental laboratory in achieving optimal esthetic outcomes and reduced patient morbidity. Dr. Levine will emphasize the "Team Approach" involving careful diagnosis and management of soft and hard tissues and their appropriate sequence in therapy when insufficiencies exist. Treating patients comprehensively in complex prosthetic and esthetic reconstructions from immediate single tooth provisionalization to full arch immediate loading which he has been performing since 1994 ("SameDay Smile") will be discussed. Practice management techniques will also be addressed for improving case acceptance and how the "Team Approach" can make this process seamless, successful, and personally rewarding. The "10 Keys for Successful Esthetic-Zone Single Immediate Implants" suggest that a team protocol, if strictly followed sequentially, would provide high predictability in preventing implant complications. The proposed "10 Keys" clinical checklist, confirmed in 4 CBCT/Clinical patient studies, ensures high esthetic success rates and happy patients (based on PES/WES and PROMS). Lastly, 4 future publications relating to the "10 Keys" that Dr. Levine is co-authoring with Drs. Mauricio Araujo, Debora Dias, and Ping Wang (University of Maringa, Brazil and Temple University) on a series of retrospective single tooth immediate central incisor implants from Dr. Levine's practice will be reviewed. Recent Compendium publications (2017, 2018, 2021) co-authored with Dr. Jeff Ganeles on the "10 Keys Concept" will be presented.



AAP Annual Meeting Comes to Florida

Florida welcomed the American Academy of Periodontology in a big way this past November in Miami for the 107th AAP Annual Meeting. **Dr. James Wilson**, 2020-2021, AAP President and past FAP President, addressed the membership and guests in his final speech as president. Below are excerpts from his address. Thank you, Dr. Wilson, for your leadership and service.

“It’s hard to believe that my year as your President is already coming to an end. Serving in this role has been the biggest honor of my professional life. During the past year, the board and I have done our best to deliver the quality governance you deserve, and to sharpen our strategic focus on things that matter most to you. This has included conducting efforts to more actively engage with pre- and post-doctoral periodontal educators, expanding our offerings in online continuing education, launching a refreshed website, perio.org, identifying ways to remain the leader in periodontal science and facilitated ways to integrate the updated disease classification into all facets of periodontics. We’ve also adopted a new core value that celebrates the diverse make-up of our global membership and ideated ways to integrate the updated disease classification into all facets of periodontics.”

“But rather than using this address to talk about the past, I’d rather talk about the future – our future. And I know that many of you are concerned about that future. I want to assure you that the future of our specialty and our Academy are bright. We have been actively engaging with promising young periodontist leaders through our Leadership Engagement and Action (LEAD) program for the past five years. If these intelligent, energetic individuals are indicative of the caliber of professionals that are shoring up our ranks, we are in the best of hands.”

“Wayne Gretzky is considered one of the greatest hockey players of all time. He wasn’t the biggest, the fastest, or the strongest in his sport, yet he owns virtually every scoring record in the National Hockey League; in fact, no one is even close. When asked how he was able to consistently outperform his formidable opponents, he replied, “I don’t skate to where the puck is. I skate to where the puck is going.” I can’t think of a better metaphor for success in any profession.”

“Technically, it’s never been the Academy’s responsibility nor mission to put patients in our members’ chairs. 



AAP Trustee Report

Hello from you AAP District III Trustees, we hope this message finds you well.

Well, it finally happened! The Annual Meeting of the 2021 American Academy of Periodontology was a resounding success. In spite of the challenges posed by COVID-19, the meeting was held, friends and colleagues were able to connect on a variety of levels, and were able to receive welcome continuing education credit as well. The majority of the 2021 Annual Meeting content will be made available on the AAP's e-Learning Center by early 2022. We are also happy to report the following highlights:

- The AAP Open Forum and PerioHub message boards have been fully reinstated on the AAP Connect community. To receive email notifications of message board activity, members must opt-in via their AAP Connect profile. If assistance is needed in executing this feature, please contact the AAP; they will be happy to assist you.
- In May, the Board approved the next Best Evidence Consensus. The target date is mid-2022, and the topic is "Biologic Mediators".
- In an effort to cultivate and promote relationships with the dental hygiene community, a Dental Hygiene Engagement Initiative was approved in August 2021. The Task Force on Dental Hygiene Engagement met in June and developed a proposal for a multi-year study club model to improve communication with local dental hygienists.

- The AAP launched a new version of perio.org in late October. The overhauled site includes a fresh look and feel, with improved navigation and search functionality.
- The AAP has adopted the following recent addition to its core values: "The AAP embraces its diverse community of members and fosters a culture of inclusion, respect, and dignity". The AAP has also expressed support between ADA leadership's efforts to align itself with the ADA's advocacy activities, relative to its core values of diversity, equity, and inclusion.
- The AAP and Johnson & Johnson collaborated on the development of a digital experience that demonstrates the clinical applicability of staging and grading. You can access the video on perio.org.
- In 2022, the Academy will work to increase communication with Trustees, and local-level representatives. The goal is to create a joint effort between local periodontists and Trustees, to address issues at the state and regional level. This will be actualized through District Town Halls, virtual meetings where Trustees, and the local communities they represent, will have an opportunity to network and interact.

We look forward to the future as we continue to advance the specialty, and interact with our members. Until next time, stay warm, and Happy Holidays.

The FAP Bylaws revisions were noticed to voting members on November 1, 2021 and again on November 16, 2021 via email.

The proposed bylaws will be considered and voted on at the FAP Business Meeting/Luncheon, held in conjunction with the 2022 FAP Winter Meeting, on Saturday, February 12, 2022, Orlando Hilton, Orlando, FL.

Florida Board of Dentistry Report

The Florida Board of Dentistry (BOD) met in Orlando on November 19, 2021.

Ms. Hill gave the Council on Dental Hygiene report and presented the proposed rule language allowing hygienists to administer nitrous oxide under indirect supervision. Dr. Tejera informed the BOD that the Anesthesia Committee discussed the language and proposed adding special needs patients and previously sedated patients (including oral sedatives) to the American Society of Anesthesiologists (ASA) IV patients as those that must still be administered under direct supervision. The BOD unanimously approved language allowing a hygienist, with appropriate training, to administer nitrous oxide to ASA I-III patients under indirect supervision. Language also was approved that stated a hygienist, with appropriate training, can only administer nitrous oxide to ASA IV, special needs and previously sedated patients under direct supervision. This rule is not yet effective as it must still go through the administrative rulemaking process.

Dr. Tejera reported the Anesthesia Committee had a productive meeting with inspectors to discuss the amount of various drugs sedation permit holders must have in the dental office. Right now, the rule is “adequate amount.” This objective standard is causing some confusion and leading to different inspectors requiring dentists to have different amounts upon inspection. Dr. Tejera said the proposed language will be presented to the BOD in February about how to better define the quantities of drugs required so it is not left up to interpretation. The language will most likely define “sufficient

amounts to address medical emergencies” for 15 minutes in the definition section of the anesthesia rules and the definition will be based on advanced cardiovascular life support protocols. The FDA will continue to monitor and update its members accordingly.

Mr. Lawrence Harris, BOD attorney, discussed anti-trust issues again; however, this time he mentioned the Alabama BOD case and its settlement with the Federal Trade Commission. As a reminder, President Biden created the White House Competition Council, whose goal is to promote competition in the American economy. Specifically, the council will coordinate, promote, and advance federal government efforts to address overconcentration, monopolization, and unfair competition in or directly affected the American economy. As a result, dental licensure and practice act issues will be scrutinized and all regulatory boards will increase anti-trust enforcement.

There were five disciplinary cases, one informal hearing, one determination of waiver, two petitions for modification of final orders and two voluntary relinquishments dealing with failing to meet the minimum standard of care, ownership of a practice not entirely made up of licensed dentists and failing to keep adequate records.
