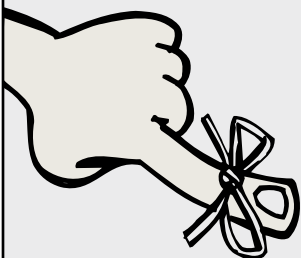

AAP District III Trustee Report

MEMBER VALUE

Recruitment/Retention

- The membership retention rate for 2022 is 93.46% compared to 92.86% for 2021.
- The AAP has recruited 369 new members in 2022, the majority of whom are periodontal residents.
- Members are able to take advantage of the 12-month payment plan where annual dues payments are split over the course of the year. Approximately 790 members currently participate in the monthly payment plan.
- The 2023 dues cycle is now open. If you have not yet paid your dues, you are encouraged to do so before December 31.

Member Communications

- The AAP launched District Town Halls in the spring of 2022. These live, interactive forums, aim to provide members with a way to engage with their trustees and learn about Academy initiatives.
- As a reminder, the AAP Member Directory is available online via AAP Connect. You can access the Member Directory through the top navigation bar. All members are automatically opted-in to the Member Directory.
- The majority of 2022 Annual Meeting content will be made available on the AAP's e-Learning Center

Continuing Education

- The AAP offers a series of live webinars throughout the year featuring periodontal thought leaders discussing a variety of relevant topics. Visit perio.org for a list of upcoming webinars.
- There are now more than 40 podcasts featuring JOP authors discussing periodontal research and science available for download from the Wiley Online Library.

ADVOCACY

State/Federal

- The AAP continues to review various letters of support related to state and/or federal issues relevant to periodontics and signs-on as appropriate. Recent topics include: Ensuring Lasting Smiles Act (ELSA), the Oral Health Literacy and Awareness Act, and student loan reform.

Key Dental/Health Organizations

- AAP officers and staff recently attended ADA SmileCon where they met with AAP-members who serve as delegates or alternate delegates of the ADA to ensure that periodontics is adequately represented. In addition, AAP leadership met with the leaders of other recognized specialties.

Dental Education

- Under the direction of the Education Committee, the AAP launched a series of on-demand modules called AAP Education Access to fill the gaps in periodontal education. These modules intend to connect periodontal programs with thought leaders discussing topics not commonly covered.

SCIENCE

Disease Classification

- The AAP continues to leverage the updated disease classification as appropriate.
- Efforts to encourage the disease classification in ICD-10, CDT codes, and SNODENT/SNOMED are ongoing.

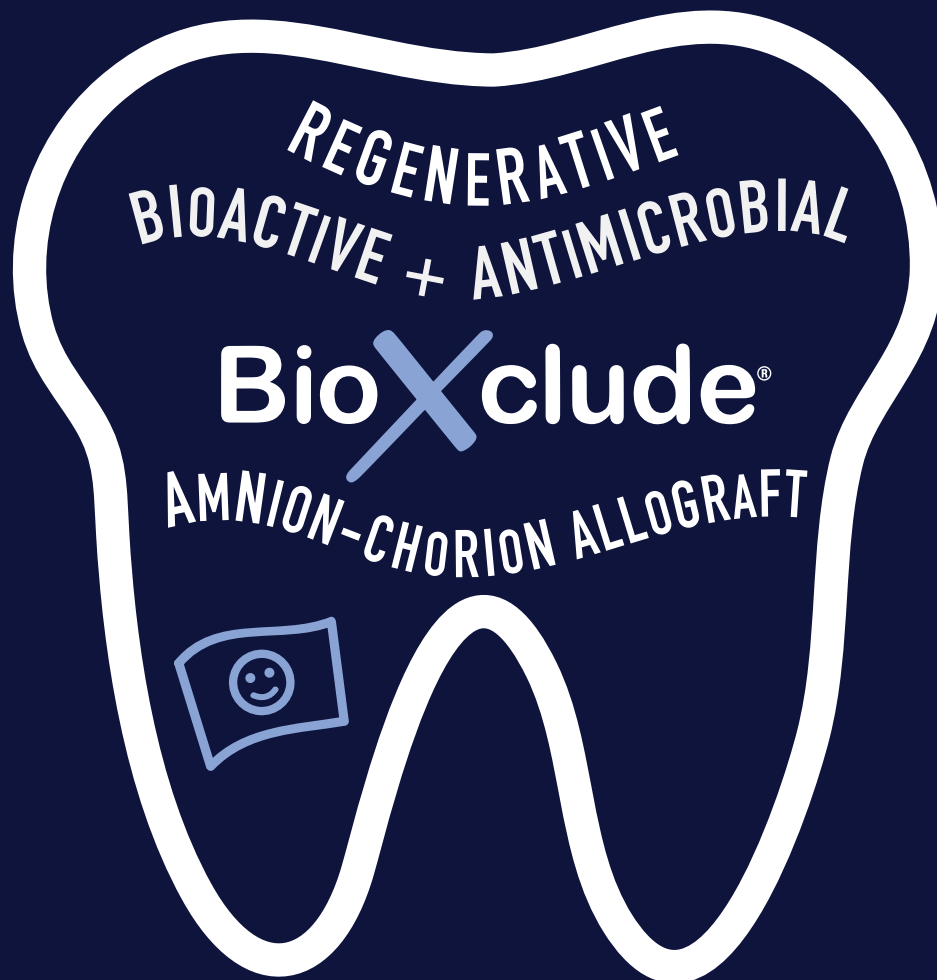
FAP Summer Meeting Review

Florida Board of Dentistry Report

The Florida Board of Dentistry (BOD) met in Dania Beach, Florida, on November 18, 2022.

A total of ten disciplinary cases including two informal hearings, four settlement agreements, three determination of waiver and one voluntary relinquishment were heard and acted upon.

Four petitions for variance or waiver were heard and acted upon. Two of which were denied.

A review of three applications for Florida dental licensure were heard. One of which ended with a voluntary withdrawal of the application.

Rules Report:

The board counsel reported on finalizing language for Rule 64B-1.002, F.A.C. which defines an unexcused absence for a board member.

A motion to add language to Rule 64B5-25.003, F.A.C. requiring a patient to be offered protective eyewear during procedures did not pass as it was agreed that this is already covered sufficiently in the CDC guidelines.

A discussion was had on Rule 64B5-2.013 and 2.0135, F.A.C. to clean up the Florida Dental Licensure Examination in regards to the ADEX examination and language for completing all parts of the examination within eighteen months. This will go to session in March 2023.

AAP District III Trustee Report (*continued*)

- Conversations with the European Federation of Periodontology are underway to identify ways to continue the conversation about the disease classification with target audiences.

Future Science Strategy

- The Task Force on Future Science met in April 2022 and prioritized the following areas over the next five years: Diagnostic technologies that detect the presence of periodontal disease and monitor progression or stability, prevention and treatment of peri-implant diseases and conditions, oral-medical integration, oral manifestations of COVID-19, precision medicine, and emerging technologies for bone and soft tissue reconstruction.
- The Task Force also plans to emphasize the inclusion of “young investigators” in this strategy to bolster the next generation of periodontal scientists.

Best Evidence Consensus (BEC)

- A BEC on biologic mediators was held in Chicago in April 2022.
- The JOP proceedings were available online in October, with the print version being published in December. A series of companion papers in CAP will also be released after the review papers have been completed, to increase the clinical utility of the BEC.

AWARENESS

Professionals

- The AAP promotes relevant scientific and clinical endeavors to medical and dental professionals, as appropriate.

Dental Hygiene

- The AAP Dental Hygiene Study Club Program is well underway. The initiative will include:
 - Downloadable study club resources to help members develop and deliver high-quality periodontal content to hygienists that positions them as a local expert and mentor.
 - A hygienist recognition program that rewards hygienists who participate in AAP member study clubs and incentivizes sustained engagement.

LEADERSHIP

Board of Trustees

- The Board of Trustees met in-person twice (May and August) and virtually four times (February, June, August, October).
- The Board began using BoardSource, a development tool targeted at non-profit Boards, to help trustees maintain a solid understanding of how to best execute their responsibilities.
- The AAP continues to utilize a professional Parliamentarian who serves as an effective resource and source of counsel in effective governance, Board relations, and fiduciary management.

Volunteers

- The AAP offered the fifth Leadership, Engagement, Action, and Development Program (LEAD) in September, with 17 participants. Drs. Bianca Newman and James Wilson were District 3 participants in the 2022 cycle of this program aimed at identifying future leaders in periodontics.

ORGANIZATIONAL VIABILITY

Financial Management

- The Board approved the 2023 budget in August 2022.
- The 2023 budget includes projected expenses \$12,230,465 and revenue is projected at \$11,750,717. The budget anticipates an operating deficit of \$479,748.
- The 2022 budget reflects a two percent increase in member dues and approximate one percent increase in Annual Meeting registration fees.

Governance and Policy

- The Workgroup to Review Governance Constitution and Bylaws completed a review of the nominations and elections policy as well as the awards and honors policy to ensure consistency and alignment with the Academy’s oversight documents.
