Understanding the Impact of Biology, Biomechanics and Biochemistry on Hard and Soft Tissues

The widespread acceptance of an initial adaptation of the marginal bone down to the first thread has recently been challenged by the hypothesis that so-called "platform-switching" accommodates an increased volume for the biologic width and thereby avoids bone loss.

Over time bone loss has been attributed to a variety of factors, including an initial adaptation to load, the influence of microleakage at the implant-to-abutment junction, and the establishment of a peri-implant biologic width, in particular as it relates to the microgap at the implantto-abutment junction.

According to the theory of biologic width, the crestal bone will never exist closer than 1.5 - 2.0 mm from the microgap of a two-part implant. However, "platform-switching" has apparently demonstrated the potential for bone integration higher up the implant. In reality, the maintenance of marginal bone is a more complex process than the accommodation of the connective tissue compartment. Rather, it depends upon creating ideal conditions for bone to attach itself at the top of the implant:

- by means of the application of surface topography
- through a biomechanical rationale for distribution of functional load through the implant
- by eradication of unfavorable microbial leakage
- by the creation of space for the connective tissue compartment
- by enhancing the bone bonding properties of the implant surface

These biomechanical and biological considerations have been broadly understood and put to clinical practice with documented data over many years. This lecture will explain how this multivariate complex can help ensure true long-term maintenance of marginal bone.

At the completion of this course, participants will be able to:

- Understand what is needed for marginal bone maintenance.
- Recognize which key features have an impact on hard and soft tissue.
- Comprehend what the ideal conditions are for bone to integrate at the top of the implant.

Florida Board of Dentistry Report

The Florida Board of Dentistry (BOD) met in Gainesville on Friday, November 15, 2024.

A few main items discussed included:

Licensure applications for those applicants applying for licensure with scores from the American Board of Dental Examiners (ADEX) licensure exam taken after October 1, 2011, which is when Florida moved away from a state licensure exam and started accepting the ADEX exam.

Clarification that a dentist with a health access dental license practicing within a health access setting includes the programs of the health access setting (as defined in Ch. 466.003(15)) and is not limited to practicing within a brick-and-mortar building of the health access setting.

Proposed revision to the rule on Required Sterilization and Disinfection Procedures so that it complies with OSHA and CDC guidelines.

Licensure by endorsement.

American Academy of Periodontology District III Trustee Report

Dear Colleagues,

We are pleased to report that the November 2024 AAP Annual Meeting in San Diego was a great success. During the meeting, the AAP District 3 Forum took place, and the following is a summary of that communication within our district:

Review of District Forum Format - The format including the review of Board of Trustees actions, district nominations, and local concerns was accomplished.

AAP Foundation - Dr. Chris Richardson and Dr. Lisa Masters, Co-chairs of the AAP Foundation Capital Campaign, introduced our new Executive Director, Mr. Kyle Gorden. They also updated us on the foundation's Capital Campaign, including its goal to continue support for Education, Research, and Periodontics as a profession.

Dr. Colin Richman presented further input on the foundation and personal experience examples. Three District 3 Periodontists presented their experiences and expressed appreciation to the foundation.

Update on Academy Programs - Our own FAP colleague, Dr. Cecil White Jr., provided a review of the Academy's recent programs including a membership update, the 2030 strategic vision and arrival, and the resident retreat. Dr. White provided an update on the Dental Hygiene Engagement Initiative. He gave information on the consensus summit with AO on Peri-implantitis and that it was reviewed in the AAP session and presented the literature sources containing the results. He discussed among other programs the upcoming Toronto meeting. He encouraged all to visit the AAP website and the Member Resource Center at the meeting.

Volunteer Recruitment - A review of last year's volunteers, resources available for volunteering with the Academy and encouragement of volunteers was reviewed. The process for elected volunteers was also reviewed.

Board of Trustees Actions - Dr. Duggan reviewed the LEAD program, resident retreat, and several collaborations including the 2025 International Symposium on Periodontics and Restorative Dentistry, collaborations with the Osteology Foundation, Spanish Society of Perio on new technologies on oral reconstructive medicine.

Dr. Jennifer Doobrow was introduced in the meeting as the new District 3 Trustee.

District Nominations - Dr. Charles McBrayer provided attendees with an update of the SAP and upcoming meeting. He followed with the election of the next year's District Nominating Committee for the following year's elections.

American Board of Periodontology (ABP) - Dr. Paul Luepke, ABP Vice President, provided updates from the ABP. He discussed recruitment, and the recent addition of private practitioners' examiners including Dr. Benjamin Duval (District 3) present. Dr. Luepke discussed the ABP survey, its purpose and how it improves the process for topic selection for board evaluation of relevant topics for both qualifying and board examination.

The ABPerio Minute was discussed. The requirements to maintain certification were detailed.
